1 2 3	WHEREAS, The year of 1994 marks the fiftieth anniversary of the landing of United States armed forces at the beaches of Normandy on D-Day; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, The year of 1994 further marks the fiftieth anniversary of the liberation of the Philippines by the United States armed forces in the Pacific; and
7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, The State of Colorado wishes to honor all World War II veterans and their families and also to recognize the contributions and sacrifices made by those individuals who remained on the home front during the war; and
