

Lieut. General Calvin A.H. Waller, U.S. Army, was the Deputy Commander in Chief of the Desert Shield and Desert Storm combat in the Persian Gulf. He is largely tributed for the success of the remarkable ground war to free Kuwait and the sweep into Iraq. A native of Louisiana, he is a graduate of Prairie View A & M University, and holds a Masters and an (Honorary) Ph.D. degree. Most of his Army career has been commanding troops from the smallest to largest echelons.

With his wife, the former Marion Estes, he retired to Colorado in 1991. They have two sons.



Senator Hank Brown has represented Colorado in the United States Senate since 1990. Previously he was in the U.S. and the Colorado House of Representatives. A native Coloradan, he married Nan Morrison in 1967 and they have three children.

He volunteered for the Navy and in Vietnam earned the Air Medal with two gold stars. He holds BS, Juris Doctorate, and Masters of Law degrees.



Costas Rombocos, a native of Athens, Greece, is President and owner of the Shrine of Remembrance Mausoleums and Funeral Home. Long ago he recognized the real need of a special and visible veterans memorial program in Colorado Springs, the home of many active duty military and veteran families.
